Brief description the content of the discipline	<p>The purpose of the discipline is comprehensive study of the a wide range of social topics, including group behavior, social perception, leadership, nonverbal behavior, conformity, aggression and prejudice, social influences. social interaction. SP uses scientific methods "to understand and explain how the thought, feeling and behavior of individuals are influenced by the actual, imagined or implied presence of other human beings". Social perception and social interaction are also vital to understanding social behavior. It is important to understand how social psychology differs from other disciplines. It employs scientific methods and the empirical study of social phenomena.</p> <p>Course objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – to form a system of psychological knowledge; – formation of knowledge and skills of using psychodiagnostic techniques in analysing of specific life situations; – to intensify knowledge of psychology and communicative competence in the educational process; – to make appropriate decisions in situations that require psychological knowledge; – analysis the content of the main approaches, theoretical concepts of social and psychological phenomena and processes; – identification of socio-psychological patterns of communication and interaction, to interpretate the communication process and mechanisms of influence; – analysis of the phenomenon of "individual" and "group" in social psychology; – to characterize the essence of social relations; – to form possibilities of applying the theory of functioning in society (both in small and large groups) in everyday practice; – to consider the characteristics of disharmonious relationships and understand how to optimize interpersonal relationships; – to form the ability of students of using the psychological knowledge in a future professional activities. <p>After studying the course, the student should know:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – basic approaches, theoretical concepts of social and psychological phenomena and processes; – types and methods of adaptation, principles of action in a new situation; – the essence and patterns of personality development;
