SP uses scientific methods "to understand and explain how the thought, feeling and behavior of individuals are influenced by the actual, imagined or implied presence of other human beings". Social perception and social interaction are also vital to understanding social behavior. It is important to understand how social psychology differs from other disciplines. It employs scientific methods and the empirical study of social phenomena.
